
Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God, and steadfast love belongs to you, Holy One. For you repay to all according to their work.

We continue to offer prayers that **the stain of racism that exists on the fabric of our nation and and the tendencies toward discrimination and dehumanization in our world would be eradicated**. Give us the **strength to overcome** these sins ... *Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer* ...

For the prayers of our hearts that you, Holy One, know even when words cannot hold them...*Hear my prayer, O Lord...*
