

Lighting the Candle of Life

ALL: We light the Candle of Life - a candle that represents community, spirit, and the fullness of all of life - birth and death and all the transitions in between and beyond.

Scripture

Psalm 111

Praise the LORD! I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation.

Great are the works of the LORD, studied by all who delight in them. Full of honor and majesty are your work, and your righteousness endures forever.

You have gained renown by your wonderful deeds; you, LORD, are gracious and merciful. You provide food for those who revere you; you are ever mindful of your covenant. You have shown your people the power of your works, in giving them the heritage of the nations.

The works of your hands are faithful and just; all your precepts are trustworthy. They are established forever and ever, to be performed with faithfulness and uprightness.

The LORD sent redemption to your people; you have commanded your covenant forever. Holy and awesome is your name.

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. Your praise endures forever.

1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; but anyone who loves God is known by God. Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." Indeed, even though there may be so-

called gods in heaven or on earth--as in fact there are many gods and many lords—yet for us there is one God from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. "Food will not bring us close to God." We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.
