



Lighting the Candle of Life

You may wish to light a candle or use the photo above as a focus for this time.

ALL: We light the Candle of Life - a candle that represents community, spirit, and the fullness of all of life - birth and death and all the transitions in between and beyond.

Scripture

2 Kings 2:1-12

Now when the LORD was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take your master away from you?" And he said, "Yes, I know; keep silent."

Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here; for the LORD has sent me to Jericho." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they came to Jericho. The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take your master away from you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know; be silent."

Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground.

When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you." Elisha said, "Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit." He responded, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not." As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. Elisha kept watching and crying out, "Father,

father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.

Mark 9:2-9

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not know what to say, for they were terrified.

Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them anymore, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

The word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Prayerful Meditation

"In these chaotic times, amid disconnection, the kind of transformation needed is one in which we are aligned with our bodies, with the nature we inhabit. We must all first know that we have inherited nature. Our bodies are a form of nature; they should not be hated, abused, or slaughtered....We can acknowledge, as we walk our spiritual

paths, that there are discoveries to be made about the nature of life. It is only due to these bodies in which we live that we can even explore the path to liberation. When we begin to hold an awareness of the body as inheriting nature, then we may begin to experience a liberating tenderness, to have authentic encounters, and to reconcile kinship between us."³

The texts today depict mystical events where the physical bodies of Elijah and Jesus are markedly transformed – Elijah taken into heaven on a chariot of fire and Jesus, fundamentally altered from his usual countenance. Mystical encounter—both experiences are noted to have had a number of witnesses—escapes our boxes, checklists, and measurements of explanation as the Spirit moves within the physical world. Significantly, these texts of transfiguration of bodies then confront the above quote by Zenju Earthlyn Manuel and bring us right back to the emphasis of our individual bodies as necessary – if not vital – to our full embrace of the Spirit if we are to live into the liberating message Jesus offers and God affirms.

Through our bodies, we are called to bring about mystical, liberating transformation each day through "tenderness...authentic encounters, and to reconcile kinship between us." Through our bodies – limited though they are – we pause, focus, and call upon the Spirit to move with healing, justice, and mercy in prayer. Through our bodies, we enact our prayers and become the fulcrum of transforming light both within our circles of relationship and influence and even moreso within our own hearts and minds. May our prayer today be full-bodied, natural, as well as full-Spirited before God.

With Anthony, we celebrate that most of the staff at the West Roxbury VA have received vaccines enabling them to serve patients with less risk. We also celebrate the medical professionals, staffs, home health workers, assisted living staffs, and volunteer caregivers who have received vaccinations and are ensuring others in their care do so... *Praise God, from whom all blessings flow* ...

With Clif, we hold all **persons who are unable to receive the COVID vaccine** due to medical conditions. We hold their safety and health to Spirit's protection as they navigate prolonged and additional restrictions ...Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer...

We hold **Liz** to Christ's loving presence as she continues to work through her housing concerns and ask for perseverance as she addresses ongoing details and necessary decisions ... *Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer* ...

With Pastor Holly, we remember friends and loved ones drawn to God's nearer presence in death this week including Holly's long-time friends and mentors, **Leland Speed** and **V.A. Patterson**. For their lives and the legacies of service to their larger communities in bettering others' lives, work, and artistic expression... *Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer*...

With Harry, we celebrate the wonders of technological advancements that make life easier, more comfortable, that aid healing, and enable staying in touch with friends and family...*Praise God, from whom all blessings flow* ...

With Dorothy and Harry, we are grateful for the Worship Resource and the way it connects our FBC Needham congregation and friends in prayer and compassion each week ... Praise God, from whom all blessings flow....
