



Lighting the Candle of Life

You may wish to light a candle or use the photo above as a focus for this time.

ALL: We light the Candle of Life - a candle that represents community, spirit, and the fullness of all of life - birth and death and all the transitions in between and beyond.

Scripture

Psalm 22:23-31

You who fear the LORD, praise our God! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify God; stand in awe of God, all you offspring of Israel!

For God, you do not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; You do hide your face from me, but heard when I cried to you. From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear you.

The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek our God shall praise the LORD. May your hearts live forever!

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD; and all the families of the nations shall worship before you. For dominion belongs to the LORD, and you rule over the nations.

To you, O God, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before you shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for you.

Posterity will serve you; future generations will be told about the Lord, and proclaim your deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that you have done it.

The word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Reflection

Creator God,

We cannot hear the trees growing in the cold—seeds pushing up through the dirt into the sun.

And we cannot hear a single drop of rain, missing one in the many.

We cannot hear the weight of people's grief, a burden that so often is silent.

And we cannot hear when hearts are changed, but you can.

You hear it all.

So once again, we come to you with bowed heads and hopeful hearts, Asking that you would lend us your ears.

Help us to hear as you hear so that we can live as you lived.

We are listening. ³

PRAYING WITH PRAYER BEADS: Starting with Lent, Prayers of the People changes format to connect to the spiritual practice of using prayer beads. This ancient practice of holding a strand of beads to help focus the mind and body during prayer has been a

very meaningful form of prayer throughout Christian history. As your fingers move from one bead to the next, you pray, sometimes the same prayer again and again and sometimes a different, personal prayer with each bead.

Moving through Lent, you may wish to pray Prayers of the People (or your own prayers) by following along with the prayer beads printed in the Worship Resource or perhaps color each bead as you pray. You may choose to make your own prayer beads or use a set significant to you. However you choose to enter into our weekly congregational prayers, know the act of prayer is holy conversation through the Spirit of God as we journey within the purple shades of Lent's path. May the prayer beads nurture and support this sacred worship. *Pastor Holly*

Instructions are included in <u>purple italics</u> throughout the prayers so you can follow along with the beads.

Prayers of the People

Enter this time in song. If you don't know the tune, let the words be the doorway to your prayer.

Sung Prayer

Hear My Prayer, O Lord

Hear my prayer, O Lord. Hear my prayer, O Lord. I am asking, hear my prayer, O Lord.

Prayerful Meditation

Holding or sitting with the image of your prayer beads, enter a quiet pause with this prayerful meditation:

Often the first step to change is listening.

I have to listen to those I've hurt.

I have to listen to creation as she cries.

I have to listen to the voice of the oppressed,

If I ever hope to make things right.

So today as I begin my prayer,

I will start with a moment of silence —

A moment to listen.

And then I will add my voice to the larger communal prayer trusting that God is always listening,

And that God's ears listen with love.5

Place your finger on the cross and begin the prayer with these words:

As a community of faith gathered in Spirit when we cannot be in person as we are accustomed, we offer our hearts and voices in prayer where we are, entrusting the Spirit's moving among us and responding far beyond our individual reach and influence...

Place your finger on the **first three beads** above the cross saying:

Bead 1: Creator God, hear my prayer.

Bead 2: Loving Christ, hear my prayer.

Bead 3: Abiding Spirit, hear my prayer.


The 4 ridged beads mark off four themed sections of our Prayers of the People. Each ridged bead is followed by 5 smooth beads that represent five specific prayers from our FBC Needham community that are related to that theme. Your finger will move from bead to bead around the loop until you have prayed with each bead and return to the original three beads and cross.

1st Theme: Gratitude & **Thanksgiving**

Place your finger on the first ridged bead above the original three smooth beads saying:

O God, thank you for each new day and all that it brings. You promise to provide all that I




Move to the **first set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers of gratitude & thanksgiving along with those of our community of faith:

- **Bead 1:** With Barbara for the meditations and prayers in the weekly Worship Resource that are so meaningful.
- Bead 2: With Bev, Andrew, and Clif, for Clif's sister receiving the COVID vaccine; Trevor received his second shot; and Wren and her mother receiving a negative COVID test.
- **Bead 3:** With Anthony for having time off from work to rest and restore body, mind, and spirit.
- Bead 4: With Dorothy and
 Barbara for Pastor
 Daryn and Pastor
 Holly's weekly calls
 and ministries.
- Bead 5: With Dorothy for our congregation's ongoing vocational discernment through Creative Callings and the promise and hope it holds for offering blessing and benefit far beyond our individual imaginings.

2nd Theme: Personal & FBC Needham Concerns

Place your finger on the second ridged bead saying:

Faithful God, you know me inside and out, all my hopes and dreams, fears and failures. Guide and support the FBC Needham community and me as we seek to follow Jesus's teachings and life's ministry while sharing the concerns of our hearts as I pray...

Move to the **second set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers of concern along with those shared within our community of faith:

- **Bead 1:** With Liz as she continues to move through her housing transition and navigate the complexities of change.
- **Bead 2:** With Bev for the frustration of trying to run errands and grocery shop as safely as possible.
- **Bead 3:** With Bev and Andrew as they continue to look for an available appointment for their first COVID vaccine.
- *Bead 4:* With Clif for the comfort of animal companions who help make long, uneventful days and boredom more endurable with their presence.
- Bead 5: With Pastor Holly for the careful and diligent work of our Office Manager, Robin, and Financial Secretary, Cindy, in maintaining the daily work of the congregation that they and their families remain healthy and in good spirits.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer....

3rd Theme: Healing, Solace, & Courage

Place your finger on the third ridged bead saying:

God of mercy and peace, your people cry out to you for healing and comfort, courage and strength. Surround your children known and unknown to me with your watch care and abiding presence, as I pray...

Move to the **third set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers for Spirit's comfort, healing, and peace saying:

- Bead 1: With the family and friends of Anna McWhorter (age 99) who entered God's nearer presence January 13, 2021, that they find pervasive peace and consolation in the light and legacy of her life among us.
- Bead 2: With Ernie and Clif in Clif's significant reduction of symptoms and neuropathy as he continues to feel more himself and his treatments provide relief; and for Ernie's continued treatments and wellbeing in between; and for the ongoing physical health and mental stamina of senior citizens in our community.
- **Bead 3:** With Barbara for Spiro's continued healing and wellbeing.
- **Bead 4:** With Louise for the continued health and well-being for souls we know and love and souls we do not know or find difficult to love.
- **Bead 5:** With Liz and her family as they mourn the death of her relative Donna who died after extended ill health that they be comforted as she enters your nearer presence.

Lord, in your mercy, hear my prayer....

4th Theme: Community, Nation, & World

Place your finger on the fourth ridged bead saying:

God of compassion and justice, there is so much in the news that is painful, from natural disasters to governmental actions to hunger, poverty, and violence. And there are so many instances of lovingkindness, beauty, and hope. Move among your creation and your children, as I pray...

Move to the **fourth set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers for Spirit's moving:

Bead 1: With humankind as we grapple with the continued ravages of COVID19 and as we stand with the families and friends within our own country who grieve the deaths of the 500,000+ precious souls who were among us just a year ago.

- Bead 2: With Clif in awaiting the first signs of spring with longer days, daffodils breaking through the earth, and the promise of crocus as we endure the cold of late winter.
- *Bead 3:* With Dorothy for the continued need to not grow complacent with pandemic safe practices to continue to mask, to distance, and to endure in order to care for each other.
- **Bead 4:** With Ernie for the numerous services provided to meet ongoing and new needs of folks in Needham, especially Meals on Wheels.
- Bead 5: With Clif for the continued efforts of caring for our earth, renewable energy technologies, and the critical need to enact transformational change in our daily habits, communal priorities, and global wellbeing.

 For the moving of your Spirit in hope and healing throughout our world, praise God, from whom all blessings flow ... And for your enduring presence, justice, and mercy in our brokenness, Lord, in your mercy, hear my prayer....

Concluding the Prayer

Return to the **first ridged bead** saying:

For the prayers of my heart that you, Holy One, know even when words cannot hold them...*Hear my prayer*, *O Lord*...

You may wish to use the original 3 beads to offer your own prayers.
