



Scripture

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?"

He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

The word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Reflection

Pray remember what I have recommended to you, which is, to think often on God, by day, by night, in your business, and even in your diversions. God is always near you and with you: leave God not alone. You would think it rude to leave a friend alone who came to visit you: why then must God be neglected? Do not then forget God, but think on God often, adore God continuously, live and die with God; this is the glorious employment of a Christian. In a word, this is our profession; if we do not know it, we must learn.²


Instructions are included in <u>pink italics</u> throughout the prayers so you can follow along with the prayer beads or the provided drawing of beads.

Prayers of the People

Prayerful Meditation

Holding or sitting with the image of your prayer beads, enter a quiet pause with this prayerful meditation:

Wait for the Lord, Whose day is near. Wait for the Lord, Be strong, take heart."³



We Hold in Prayer...

Many of this week's prayers are requests from members of our congregation in the past week.

If you have general or specific prayer requests - joys as well as concerns - to share please contact Holly or Daryn to pass them along.

Place your finger on the cross and begin the prayer with these words:

As a community of faith gathered in Spirit when we cannot be in person as we are accustomed, we offer our hearts and voices in prayer where we are, entrusting the Spirit's moving among us and responding far beyond our individual reach and influence...

Place your finger on the **first three beads** above the cross saying:

- Bead 1: Creator God, hear my prayer.
- Bead 2: Loving Christ, hear my prayer.
- Bead 3: Abiding Spirit, hear my prayer.

The **4 ridged beads** mark off four themed sections of our Prayers of the People. Each ridged bead is followed by **5 smooth beads** that represent five specific prayers from our FBC Needham community that are related to that theme.

1st Theme: Gratitude & Thanksgiving

Place your finger on the **first ridged bead** (A) above the original three smooth beads saying:

O God, thank you for each new day and all that it brings. You promise to provide all that I need, caring not only for me, but for all creation and so I rejoice...

Move to the **first set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers of gratitude & thanksgiving along with those of our community of faith:

- Bead 1: With Anne that Bruce is doing well and his blood factors are well monitored and the goodness of stabilized health.
- **Bead 2:** With John in the joy of family together over Mother's Day and "chaos at its finest" with everyone together.
- Bead 3: With Mark Holley who was able to be with family at his son's wedding in Texas and the goodness of celebration.
- **Bead 4:** With Harry for worship services on the lawn.
- Bead 5: With Dorothy, Anne, and Harry for the flowers Pastor Daryn provided on Mother's Day.
 - Praise God, from whom all blessing flow....

2nd Theme: Personal & FBC Needham Concerns

Place your finger on the second ridged bead (B) saying:

Faithful God, you know me inside and out, all my hopes and dreams, fears and failures. Guide and support the FBC Needham community and me as we seek to follow Jesus's teachings and life's ministry while sharing the concerns of our hearts as I pray...

Move to the **second set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers of concern along with those shared within our community of faith:

- **Bead 1:** With Marty as her recovery continues to ebb and flow.
- **Bead 2:** With Jessica in considering next steps for herself and her family.
- Bead 3: With Harry in concern for his friend of 70 years, Mary McKeever.
- *Bead 4:* With Liz for continuing to be held to God's safekeeping through the prayers and lovingkindness of her FBC congregation as she works through her housing concerns.
- **Bead 5:** With John, Pastor Daryn, and Pastor Holly for the congregation's faithful decisions with *Creative Callings*.
 - Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer....

3rd Theme: Healing, Solace, & Courage

Place your finger on the third ridged bead (C) saying:

God of mercy and peace, your people cry out to you for healing and comfort, courage and strength. Surround your children known and unknown to me with your watch care and abiding presence, as I pray...

Move to the **third set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers for Spirit's comfort, healing, and peace saying:

- *Bead 1:* With Stan for his daughter, Julia, in Toronto, who is awaiting access to the COVID vaccination along with many other people in Canada that they remain healthy and safe.
- **Bead 2:** With Liz for her cousin Elaine's continued recovery from hip surgery.
- **Bead 3:** With Ernie as his return to treatment remains delayed and he navigates additional medical tests and visits.
- **Bead 4:** For the individuals and families and friends of persons continued to be gunned down in mass shootings throughout our country that their pain, recovery, and grief will be met with justice, healing, and a turning from our cultures of and penchant for violence.
- Bead 5: With families and friends grieving the deaths of loved ones to COVID in the last year and who continue to live in concern and fear for unvaccinated loved ones and persons impacted by new variants.

Lord, in your mercy, hear my prayer....

4th Theme: Community, Nation, & World

Place your finger on the fourth ridged bead (D) saying:

God of compassion and justice, there is so much in the news that is painful, from natural disasters to governmental actions to hunger, poverty, and violence. And there are so many instances of lovingkindness, beauty, and hope. Move among your creation and your children, as I pray...

Move to the **fourth set of 5 smooth beads**, and offer your prayers for Spirit's moving:

- **Bead 1:** With Harry for the students he worked with at Olin College this semester as their term ends that their work, ingenuity, and creativity continue to better the world.
- **Bead 2:** With Ernie for the goodness and wellbeing each member of the congregation and how we each reach out to our circles of relationships each day.

- Bead 3: For the students, teachers, families, and community of Kazan, Russia, who grieve the deaths of friends, classmates, a colleague, and beloved family members in a school shooting.
- Bead 4: With Pastor Holly in celebrating her dear friend, Hank, in graduating with his Master of Divinity from Methodist Theological Seminary of Ohio, and her good friend, McKenna, in her ordination into ministry through the Presbyterian Church, USA.
- Bead 5: For BIPOC persons who continue to endure the scourge of racism, hatred, denigration, and dismissal even when the spotlight of public attention turns away, that we may remain vigilant in ensuring each person is dignified as a child of God and nothing less.

 For the moving of your Spirit in hope and healing throughout our world, praise God, from whom all blessings flow ... And for your enduring presence, justice, and mercy in our brokenness, Lord, in your mercy, hear my prayer....

Concluding the Prayer

Return to the first ridged bead (A) saying:

For the prayers of my heart that you, Holy One, know even when words cannot hold them...*Hear my prayer, O Lord...*

You may wish to use the original 3 beads to offer your own prayers.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever.

India COVID Crisis Donation Appeal

through International Ministries of ABCUSA

International Ministries continues to work with partner conventions and mission hospitals in India to respond to the need of the current COVID crisis. We are raising funds to help mission hospitals to purchase life-saving equipment like ventilators and oxygen concentrators, and PEE for doctors, nurses, and hospital workers.

The Board of the Vellore Foundation has approved \$250,000 to help the Christian Medical College and Hospital in Vellore, India, to respond to the current COVID crisis.
