## Reflection

#### Beloved Community,

For nearly three years, our congregation has been moving through a process of intentional and faithful discernment toward the will of God for our congregation and its resources - Creative Callings at FBC Needham. With deep intention and care we moved through this process of Creative Callings, incorporating prayer, deep listening and careful speech, conversations with ministry and community partners, and attunement to the movement of the Holy Spirit in our midst. This communal, Spiritled and Christ-centered process enabled us to hold difficult conversations and questions related to our own sustainability and capacity, alongside hope-filled possibilities about how our resources might best serve the needs of our neighbors for this time in the life of our church. The question of how we are best able to live out our Christian witness was at the center of our discernment. Ultimately, the majority of participants in the Creative Callings process felt that God was calling this church community to close and redistribute its resources to the needs of the community and our world.

#### The vote ...

On Sunday, June 27, 2021, our congregation gathered for worship to honor the conclusions of the Creative Callings process and to seek the will of the congregation. A business meeting was conducted in accordance with our bylaws and with a quorum present at which a majority voted in favor (10-1) of a motion that the Administration Ministry be entrusted to develop a closing plan for First Baptist Church in Needham.

#### Holding the pain alongside our hope ...

We honor the deep faithfulness and legacy of First Baptist Church - throughout its 165 years of existence and over the course of these more recent months. We also acknowledge the painful and emotional journey this has been at times, and recognize that some aspects of the process yet to come may hold moments of deep sadness and loss for our community as well. And yet, we also hold onto hope - hope for future

possibilities, hope in a creative God who assures us of the life-giving promise of a new thing (Isaiah 43:19). And we continue to trust - we trust in our Gospel through Jesus Christ that assures new life beyond endings. Death does not have the last word when Christ is a part of the story, and Christ is - and has always been - a part of our story, First Baptist Church in Needham. The love of Jesus and care for our neighbors is central to our legacy, and it is our great hope that through our ending, something of our legacy will be reborn - yielding a life-giving, healing, and Christ-like witness for our community and our world.

#### As we move forward ...

As our Administration Ministry discerns how best to proceed toward the will of the congregation, we will do our very best to remain transparent and to keep you informed of significant developments over the course of this process. Your pastors will be with you through the next phase of this journey, accompanying each member of our community in their discernment to find a new spiritual home for their journeys of faith when requested. We will no longer gather regularly for worship on Sunday mornings so that you are able to explore new opportunities and communities for worship and spiritual enrichment. And, if you so desire it, we will come with you to the services and connect you with resources for pastoral care in your new church home. On Sunday evening, September 12, we plan to gather for a service of communion and prayer, subsequently gathering on the first Sunday evening of each month going forward, in order to pray for and connect with one another as we move through this time of transition. Our Calls of Caring and Worship Resources will continue.

As with any matter that concerns the life and well being of this community of faith, you are welcome to bring any question, prayer, joy or concern to Pastor Daryn, pastordaryn@fbcneedham.org, or Pastor Holly, pastorholly@fbcneedham.org. Our prayers are certainly with you already, and we are holding this beloved community of Christ in our hearts as we move forward with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

## **Amended Motion Approved**

That First Baptist Church in Needham (hereinafter the "Church") develop a plan for closing, and that the Administration Ministry of the Church shall be authorized to take such steps and actions as are appropriate and/or necessary to develop the closing plan, which would include, but not limited to, the disposition of any and all property of the Church, real or personal, upon such terms and conditions as the Administration Ministry may deem appropriate. The plan would be developed in accordance with such laws and regulations as may govern or be applicable to such closing plan. The closing plan and the recommendations developed by the Administration Ministry will be presented to the Church for approval.

many years. I want to share my college essay as I believe this shows my faith, my work ethic and how I like to help others...

When I was little, I could not wait to be able to use the ride on lawn mower that my father and brother Cole used to mow the lawn. It was not so much about mowing the lawn it was about driving the lawn mower. Finally, the day arrived, and I got to drive the lawn mower by myself and now that job became mine! At the time, I did not realize what the next few years had in store for me...


My freshman year of high school, I decided that I want to start making some money, however I was only fourteen and it was hard to get a job at this young age. It was at this time I thought, why don't I start a little lawn mowing business in my neighborhood. There were several neighbors with little kids and busy schedules, as well as a few elderly people. I asked a few of my neighbors if they wanted their lawn done, one said yes, and the other said no. After a few weeks, the neighbor that originally said no, saw how I was good at mowing, he finally came back and hired me. That summer I had three clients and when winter came, I asked if they wanted me to snow blow their driveways. Now I was earning money in the summer and winter and I could make my own schedule to fit in my schoolwork and sports.

I picked up a few more over the next couple years and was making good money and helping others. I now had a small lawn care and snow removal business, I never really thought about having a name for my business until I thought about an instance with one of my neighbors when I started moving their lawn. They were new to the country and were learning the English language. For a very long time they called me Nicholas, I would always tell them that my name was Will but they would still call me Nicholas, and one year they gave me a Christmas card and it was addressed to Nicholas. My family and friends thought it was funny and started calling me and my business Nicholas' Lawn Care. My neighbors will recommend me to others and tell them my name is Nicholas. Now all my clients and neighbors were calling me Nicholas.

My hard work in the neighborhood has really paid off. This summer I was hired to mow a lawn in the next town, which is almost the size of a big field. This has brought my total to six lawns that I take care of, and I expanded my business to trimming trees, mulching, cleaning, and power washing houses.. I have even hired a few of my friends on the big jobs.

My small little business has taught me a lot, it is not just about the money, I think that this experience really helped me become more mature, more hardworking, and more responsible. I have learned many great skills that will be valuable to me though life. I know how to interact with adults, manage my time and money and have great negotiating skills!! When people say they work at Target or somewhere, I think to myself, *That's cool but I built my own business at the age of sixteen*. This makes me proud of myself and makes me feel that I can do anything that the world throws at me. **I have faith in myself!**

#### Essay by Andrew Dodoo for the Ambach Scholarship at FBC, Needham

In Ghana, West Africa 2016, I was brutally attacked by a tenant who poured acid on me in my father's house. I was severely burned, not knowing if I was going to die or not. I was feeling intense heat and pain, I could see my skin melting. I ran straight to a friend's house and wept for help. I was devastated. I thought this acid burn was going to end my life.

I was hospitalized for seven months in Ghana. I was 16 years old and also on a soccer team. I was not able to continue school or soccer. I was fighting for my life, and it felt like I would never get better. I was vulnerable, incapacitated, and sad. I was dying. I was so scared I thought nothing could be done, but I never lost hope,

As my health was deteriorating my brother made contact with a hospital in the United States so that I could have a more successful treatment. I was brought to Boston, MA to get my medical care from Shriners Hospital for Children. At Shriners I had over 23 surgeries. Amazingly, I was able to go back to school and to play soccer during my treatment. There were times when I could have given up, but I never did. Because to me, giving up is not an option.

I am currently in my final year of high school and eager to continue my journey through college. This acid burn experience has taught me a lot about life. I am a very ambitious person, who has always had hopes and dreams to become a professional soccer player. Honestly, all the struggles that I have been through have made me stronger. This experience has been an opportunity in my life, even though it is not a good thing, still it has made me who I am and has gotten me to where I am today. I have come a long way and I can't just give up no matter how tough things get. Nothing can stop me from achieving my dreams.

I am grateful to God for still being alive. I feel so blessed and happy even though it was a huge setback for me. I was out of school for about two years, nonetheless I knew that it was never too late to pursue my dreams. I still have time to do everything I have always wanted to do. I have learned what real hope is, how to always focus on the positive and see what is possible, recognize the good that comes out of the bad, and that everything happens for a reason. This experience taught me how to overcome any kind of obstacle I might encounter. I am alive and with God's help nothing can stop me. Our greatest glory in life is not in never falling, but in rising every time we fall. I will always keep my faith high and strong, no matter what happens, I will stay positive.
