



Lighting the Candle of Life

You may wish to light a candle or use the photo above as a focus for this time. ALL: We light the Candle of Life - a candle that represents community, spirit, and the fullness of all of life - birth and death and all the transitions in between and beyond.

Advent Candle Lighting - Week 1 / Hope

- Light a candle in your home or in your heart. Adapt the following words for your use and circumstances. Though they are written for two voices, they can be read as one, or shared in reading with many.
- A: I dream of sunflower fields.
- B: I dream of key lime pie with a mile-high meringue.
- A: I dream of the days when we could be part of a crowd.
- B: I dream of snow days.
- A: I dream of empty beds in jail cells.
- B: I dream of a world that will let kids be kids.
- A: I dream of full tables instead of empty bellies.
- B: I dream of schools with enough money to teach.
- A: I dream of parents with enough money to feed.
- B: I dream to keep awake, because if we don't dream of better days, then we might forget that this is not what God imagined.

A: So today we light the candle of hope, for hope is the very thing that keeps dreams afloat.

Light candle.

- B: May this light be an invitation to keep awake.
- A: May this light be our invitation to be Advent people—people who dream. Amen.

The First Sunday in Advent THOSE WHO DREAM... *keep awake* (hope)



Mark 13:24-37 | Isaiah 64:1-9 | Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19

Those who dream do not fall asleep to the realities of the world. God prompts us to pay attention to where God's dreams for change and new life are emerging. In Advent, we remember that God's ultimate dream is to be intimately connected to us—to come down and dwell among us. As we keep awake, we join Isaiah and the psalmist in pleading for restoration and for God to draw near.

The First Week of Advent THOSE WHO DREAM... keep awake (hope)

Dream, Don't Sleep / Mark 13:24-37 & 2 Peter 3:8-15

They say you will come like a "thief in the night," The hour unclear, the day easily feared.

But I toss these words over the edge of my tongue, And they don't taste right.

A thief is one that I lock out. A thief is the one that I fear.

So I ask myself— Did I downgrade you to no more than a thief, Great Builder? Did you form me from the dust, Breathe life into my bones, And paint the horizon into the sky, all for me?

And was all of that fine, Until you asked me to love my neighbor as myself? Was all of that fine, Until you said, "Dream, don't sleep"? Was all of that fine, Until you asked me to wake up to the suffering in the streets?

Did I imprison you to the role of the thief To keep you from getting too close?

Forgive me, Great Builder. Tear down the door to my house. Crawl through the window. Slip through the attic fan. Dance in the security light. Scream through the letterbox until I hear you again. For this house is your house. You built it. You belong here. I am begging you, Break back in.

"...prayer and meditation can be thought of as the creation of a mental space in which the energies of dreaming and the concerns of waking life are invited to meet each other and to have a mutual, open-ended conversation."²

We continue to hold **Ernie** in our hearts as he persists in treatment and healing through cancer ... Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer ...

We give thanks that **Helen** is **doing well and has finished her treatments** for now. With her son, John, we pray **for the good health of Helen, Elaine, and their family** ... Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer ...

God, as the numbers of COVID-19 cases continue to rise, we pray **for our world**. We pray **for all those who have been ill**, and particularly **for those who have lost** **loved ones to this virus**. We pray **for the development of vaccines and treatments** that will safely and effectively give hope to our world and end this pandemic ... *Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer* ...

With Pastor Holly, we continue to hold **Gray and Eda Jackson** in our prayers. Eda remains in the hospital for a second week, and doctors are having difficulty getting her oxygen level up. Eda's daughter prays **for her strength and comfort** in this time. 
Passing of the Peace

One: Let us greet one another in peace as we prepare for the journey ahead.

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


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Announcements
