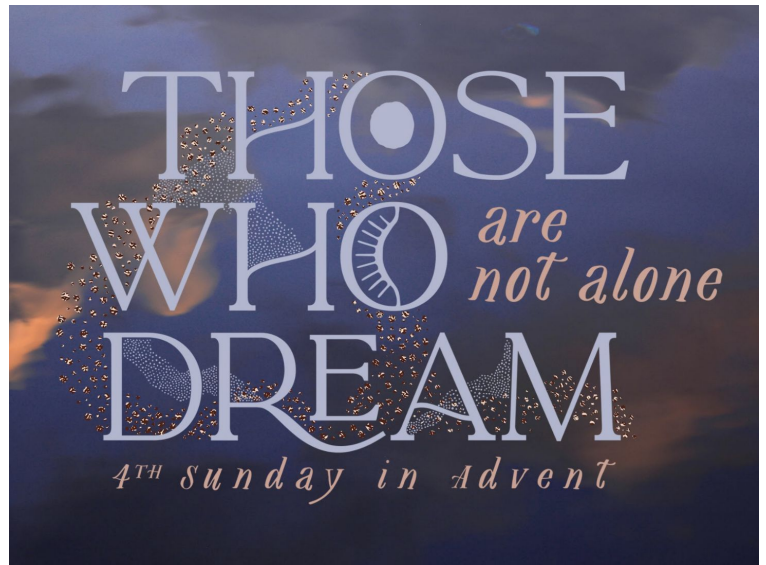

ALL: We light the Candle of Life - a candle that represents community, spirit, and the fullness of all of life - birth and death and all the transitions in between and beyond.

Advent Candle

Lighting - Christmas Eve litany/Lighting of the Christ Candle

Light a candle in your home or in your heart. Adapt the following words for your use and circumstances. Though they are written for two voices, they can be read as one, or shared in reading with many.

Candle Lighting Liturgy | The Christ Candle

A: In the beginning, God dreamed of a beautiful world.

B: In Egypt, the Israelites dreamed of freedom.

A: In the wilderness, the people dreamed of safety.

B: In Jerusalem, the people dreamed of a Messiah.

A: In Bethlehem, the shepherds and Wise Men dreamed of a new beginning.

B: Then, several years later, Jesus walked this earth and dreams came true.

A: The sick were healed.

A: The poor had food.

B: The forgotten and ignored were seen.

A: The children were welcomed.

B: Everyone was invited to the table, and the world has never been the same.

A: So tonight, we are those who dream.

B: Tonight, we dream the same dreams of our ancestors before us.

A: Tonight, we dream of justice and mercy, of love and kindness, of peace and hope.

B: Tonight we dream of a God that draws near to us out of unfailing love.

A: May this candle be a reminder that there will be a day when every dream will be fulfilled.
And until then, we will be those who dream.

FOCAL SCRIPTURES Luke 2:1-20 | Isaiah 9:2-7

THEME CONNECTIONS

The Christmas story reminds us that we are all dreamers. Like those gathered around the manger, we come to this night each year with awe, wonder, and holy imagination for what is possible. Like Mary, we treasure God's dream in our hearts and commit to keeping it alive. Like the holy family, we believe and trust in a God who comes to us in the vulnerability of a child.

Because there's so much to say and not enough time.

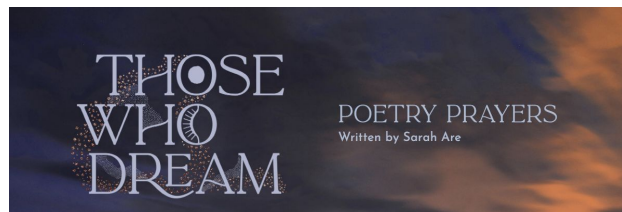
It's that full to the brim,

We give thanks that **Stan Gibson and family** are all healthy and doing well ... *praise God, from whom all blessings flow ...*

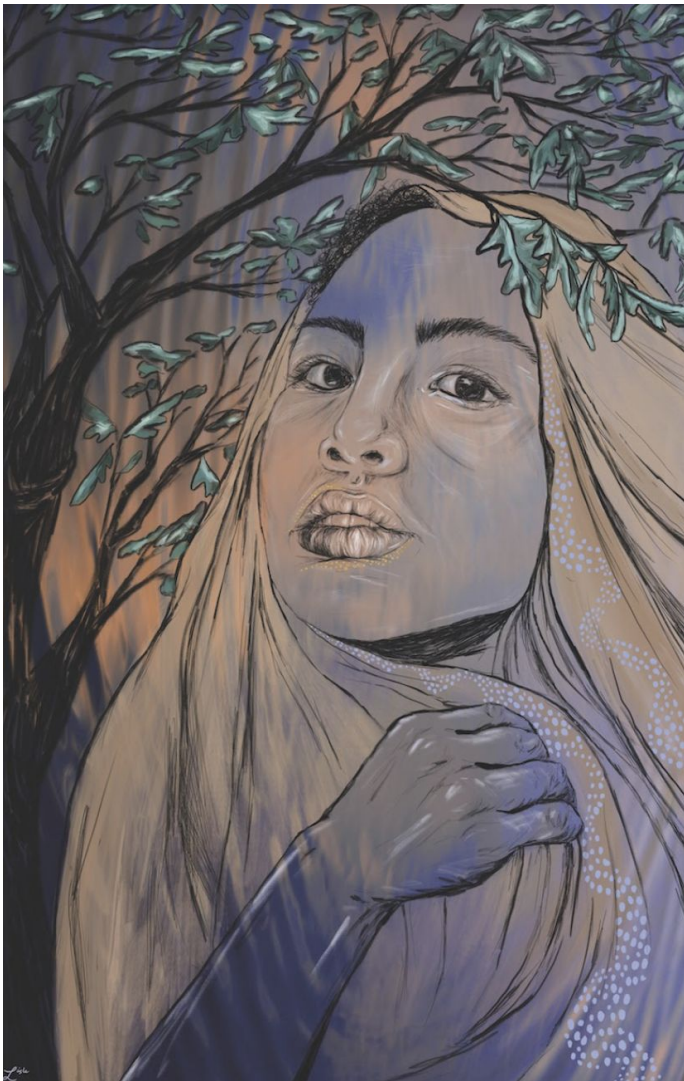

One: The peace of Christ be with you.

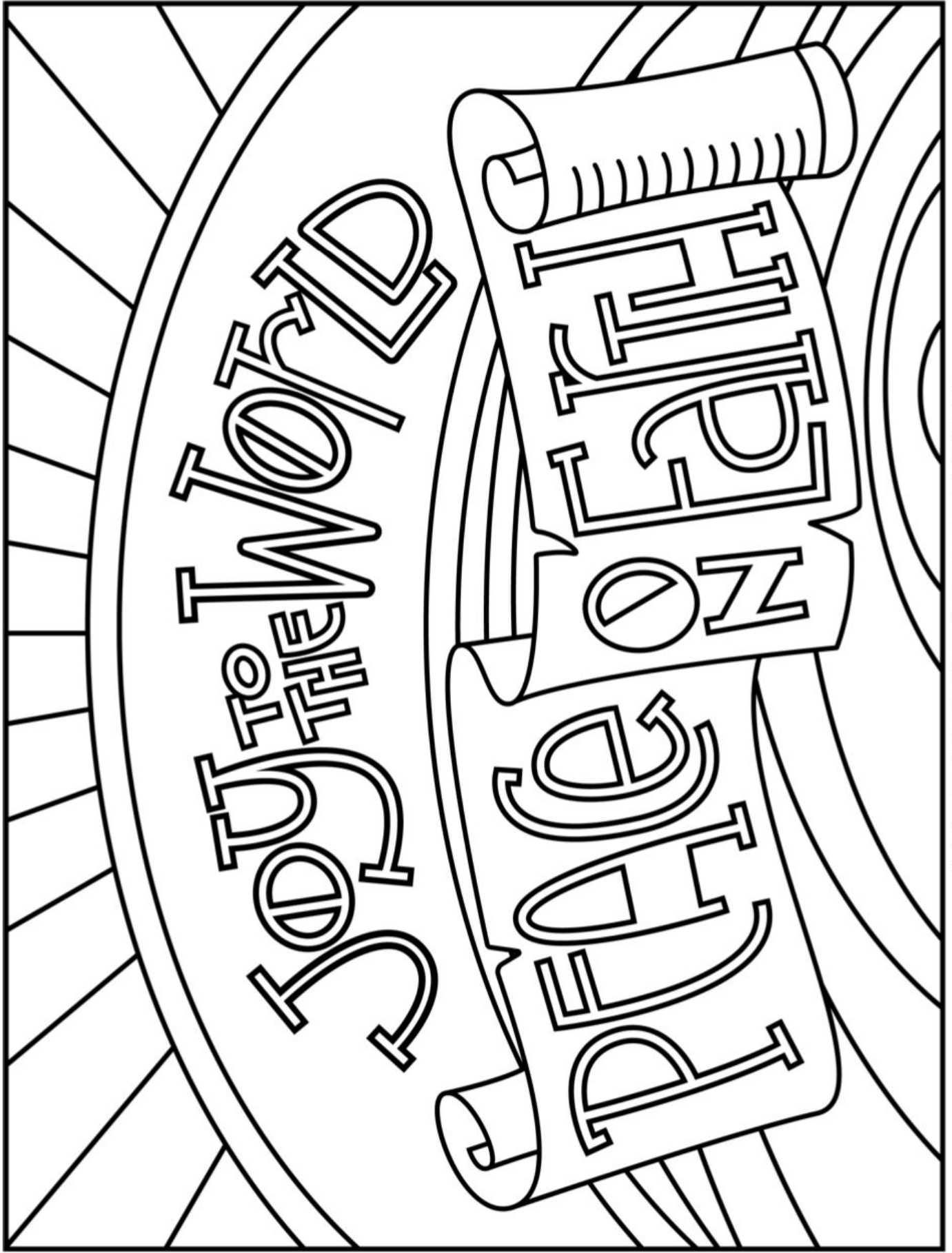
