Transformed by Generosity

Dear FBC Needham Community

I have been learning the art of pottery recently – wheel throwing to be exact. It is a humbling endeavor. Just the elemental step of learning to center your clay on the wheel is a growing edge for me – so I never know from time to time what will emerge, if anything, or if my clay will flop or pot collapse. At any point in the process from throwing, to bisquing, to glazing, to firing, to cooling, to traveling from here to there – your pot can break, or explode, or the glaze can stick to the kiln, or the colors come out differently than you expected. It is all an experiment and one that takes flexibility and courage, creativity and humility to manage. Yet every now and then, you end up with something unexpectedly beautiful.

The other day, I made my first plate, and then right after that, I formed a chalice out of my lump of clay – a little communion set - tools for serving, for remembering, for hosting, for offering welcome and sustenance for the journey. If you asked me to do it again, I'm not sure I could – it just happened. I let the process use me, I offered myself to the task at hand, used the knowledge I had gained and attempted something creative and good. And this time around something beautiful emerged.

Our attempts at light, at goodness, at love are always experiments – we have what we have of ourselves to give – our hearts, our creativity, our courage - and we offer it to the task at hand. At any point in our journeys, the efforts can collapse, our best attempts fail, disappointments occur; we know that sometimes things can fall apart, and break around us and in us. Yet we try and try again because we know that sometimes something unexpectedly beautiful can emerge in our midst and for our world. And it is worth it. Keep offering your hope, peace, joy and love to the world – just as Jesus did. The light of Christ made manifest in this world is totally worth it. ~ Pastor Daryn
