We pray for **the officer(s) involved** in this shooting, that they **repent for their unnecessary use of force**, and that these all-to-common reactions and our whole system and expectations for policing in this nation and in our communities **would present themselves** to you - **would open themselves** **up to your intervention and to the transformation** that needs to come for justice and peace to reign in the hearts and systems we create ... *Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer* ...

We pray that the stain of racism that exists on the fabric of our nation and and the tendencies toward discrimination and dehumanization in our world would be eradicated. Give us the strength to overcome these sins ... Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer ...

With Dorothy, we pray for an end to fighting, an end to war, and an end to disease. In her words, "what else can we do but hope." God, we hope in you ... Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer ...
