Song of Response O Sacred Head Now Wounded PASSION CHORALE

This hymn is most often sung during Holy Week, particularly on Good Friday, when we commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus. What does it mean to hold the wounding of the sacred image of God at other times of the year, and throughout our living, as we see those made in God's image - our siblings, our neighbors around the world - suffering due to injustices and disregard for their care and well-being? What does it mean to sing this in the midst of a pandemic that has claimed more than a million lives worldwide, or at the sight of racial injustices and racially motivated violence toward black and brown folks in our world, or in recognition of the image of God in the created world itself crying out for change and restitution as we continue to spiral forward into a potentially irrevocable climate crisis? What pain and suffering is felt, what rending of the divine fabric of created beauty and miracle is witnessed - by human and divine hearts together - each time the image of God is wounded! Sing, read aloud, or listen to, "O Sacred Head Now Wounded", as sung by Nathan Drake,



Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform to the will of the Father and to do as we are told by Jesus, who has taken upon himself our sufferings and carried our sorrows to lead us, through the cross, to the joy of the resurrection. Amen.

Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Do not disdain the entreaties of we who are in trial, but deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin.

For the prayers of our hearts that you, Holy One, know even when words cannot hold them...*Hear my prayer, O Lord...*

We are delighted to creatively navigate this interesting moment in our lives of faith. Just a word of anticipation, <u>this worship experience will not be traditional!</u> Due to evidence that suggests group singing and collective responses to be unsafe, we will be experimenting with other forms of praise - drumming, streamers, clapping, etc. We trust that our praise, in whatever form it takes, will be glorifying and pleasing to God so long as we are also committed to the forms of praise God most cares about - care and justice for our neighbors (Isaiah 58, Amos 5:21-24). And in keeping with our care for you, we will continue to mail out and post online (<u>www.fbcneedham.org</u>) our At-Home Worship Resources.

We are stressing the health and well-being of everyone, so please understand **social distancing and mask wearing are a requirement for all participants!** Mingling before and after worship is discouraged. If you have been sick or are not feeling well, stay home. If you are in a vulnerable population and have underlying health conditions, or do not feel safe joining, please do not feel pressured to attend; God is with you wherever you are. Please do what feels right and safe for you and for others. If we realize we cannot accomplish this worship experience in a safe manner that upholds the dignity and health of all gathered, we will cancel until another time presents itself.

We will NOT GATHER in the event of inclement weather (rain, snow or if the forecast calls for temperatures below 55 degrees fahrenheit). In the event of poor weather we will gather via Zoom.
