A Letter from the Pastor

December 2022

This morning I received a phone call from a dear friend. I don't usually get *phone calls* from them. Every now and then I'll get a text message or Facebook message of season's greetings, or more general message of love and support. But this morning they called, all the way from Arizona, just to say hello and send some love. I was so surprised and caught off guard that my instinct was to worry – I almost asked if everything was okay – I kept waiting for the reason they had called. But the reason was simply me; they called just to let me know that they were thinking of me - that they loved me. It really meant a lot to get that phone call today. In the midst of this busy season, when folks have all the reasons in the world to savor their spare time for themselves, those closest to them, and their most pressing needs, here were a few minutes offered for me. That simple, short, phone call served as a reminder that I am loved, that my presence matters to someone in this world beyond the usual suspects of immediate family and neighbors and colleagues I see week-to-week. I was reminded in that brief moment that even when I am not thinking about it or focused on it, even when I don't expect it – it's there - the kind of love that catches you off guard, that shows up when you least expect it, that doesn't expect anything in return, that offers reassurance and goodness for the journey that is life. That kind of love, offered for me this day, gave me hope and renewed my spirit.

Years ago, God showed up unexpectedly as a babe in a manger to offer a little reminder of hope and love for our world. And the equivalents of heavenly phone calls were sent — messengers brought startling, but good news of great joy to an unwed Palestinian soon-to-be-mother, to her life partner and unsuspecting soon-to-be-father, to shepherds abiding in fields, as well as wandering seekers of wisdom and light. The message came: unto YOU is born Christ, the Lord, Immanuel "God With Us". Unto *you*. The message was simply *you*. You matter. You are beloved. God loves *you*. God loves you enough to enter into this world — to come to you with a love that is startling and surprising, that is there for you whether you are looking for it or not, that holds you in all that you are, for ever and ever and ever, offering reassurance and goodness towards your renewal. How great a love is that!

And so the message from God is simply YOU. And the message of Christmas is simply LOVE.

Creative Callings Year 3, Pivoting ADMINISTRATION STEWARDSHIP & PASTORAL ACCOMPANIMENT through TRANSITION

With a congregational vote on Sunday, June 27, 2021, the Administration Ministry was tasked with developing a plan for closing the church. Our Administration Ministry has been diligently meeting to develop a plan to bring before the congregation, while **each member of the congregation has been encouraged to do their own good work of prayerfully discerning what community of faith they may wish to visit or consider joining.** Pastor Daryn has been available, and will continue to be available, to offer spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and reflection upon request as we move forward.

The Administration Ministry has been engaged in discernment with community partners and others in ministry around future possibilities for our resources and property. All along we have been engaged with the hopes that our resources will continue to meet the needs of our Needham community and will continue to uphold and honor the legacy of First Baptist Church in Needham's ministry within the community.

Recent discernment has led us into conversations with First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain about the potential for a merger of our assets and ministries. This has been a life-giving possibility to hold. On November 4, 2022, The First Baptist Church of Jamaica Plain voted unanimously at a congregational meeting to engage in further discernment around the possibility of a merger between our congregations. On November 5, 2022, FBC Needham's Administration Ministry unanimously approved a recommendation "to pursue a mutually agreeable partnership in whatever legal form would be agreeable with FBCJP and enter into discussions and negotiations with them." Some implications of this partnership are that it would allow for our building and property to continue to steward inclusive, creative and meaningful ministry for the arts, social justice mission, and the overall wellness of our Needham community. It would facilitate an ongoing relationship with some of our most valued community partners, and community's social service providers, and would provide potential worship space for some of our neighboring Baptist and ecumenical colleagues who are in need of space for their ministries and the sharing of the Gospel – the good news of God's love.

The Administration Ministry is discerning with FBCJP what this might practically look like, and is in the beginning phases of imagining next steps with them. If it is determined that this is a feasible and agreeable way forward for both congregations, the next step would be a future congregational meeting, during which a vote would be taken to approve the recommendation of the Administration Ministry toward partnership. The Administration Ministry and your pastor will continue to keep you apprised of our process and provide support as you need it along this journey.


