A Letter from the Pastor

Dear FBC Needham Community,

I wanted to share some updates with everyone. We continue to gather on the first Sunday of every month at First Baptist Needham, for prayer and communion – and on some special occasions as well. Pastoral care is ongoing with visits, calls and accompaniment to doctor's appointments, and encouragement toward new ministry and worship opportunities for church members.

I will be traveling to the Carolinas at the end of June/beginning of July. We will not gather for worship in July but I pray that you will continue to hold one another and check in with one another in prayer and concern for that month and beyond. Our plan as of now is to resume first Sunday worship in August.

A colleague of mine, Rev. Ashlee Wiest-Laird, is on sabbatical for the summer. I will be filling in for her and First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain as their sabbatical pastor through September. Feel free to join us on Sunday mornings in person or via Zoom. Call the office if you would like the Zoom link for the worship service Sunday's at 11am. All are welcome! Don't forget to be exploring other possibilities for worship and communities of faith for your own spiritual journeys, knowing that our FBC Needham community will remain with one another in spirit as we move forward individually along our uniquely called paths.

I have news about the restoration project of our front porch! The four columns of our front porch have been removed toward the restoration project. The next step is for the steps and landing to be replaced. Upon beginning that work, it was discovered that the space within the porch itself is hollow – there is no support for columns beneath the porch currently. That aspect of the project will be re-evaluated for engineering and cost before continuing. It may slow things down a bit, but we remain hopeful that the project will be completed this summer. A temporary fence was installed today around

the front porch for safety for our community as the project unfolds. Following the restoration of the porch itself, the replacement columns will go in, made of a sustainable fiberglass composite material, along with restored capitals that look identical to the former design. The front doors will also be replaced. It is our gift to the community to restore this beautiful and historic structure. I personally cannot wait to see it looking good again.

The Administration Ministry is continuing to explore options for our building and resources toward the potential for collaborative and life-giving ministry in our community. We are being very intentional in this exploration. We hope to know more, and be able to share more, by the end of the summer. Attorneys Paul Alpert and Dick Osterberg are accompanying us through this discernment. We are grateful for their expertise in church closure and mergers, and for their guidance in this process. Your Administration Ministry is doing good work on this front, and is being deliberate and thoughtful with this task entrusted to them. If you have specific questions, please do not hesitate to be in touch with me. I am happy to have individual conversations with church members about the process.

I hope to see you on June 5th at 5pm for our Pentecost service! It is a joy and blessing to be your pastor and to witness the spirit-filled way you are holding and praying for one another in this time of transition. You are gifts to one another and to the world. Thank you for offering yourselves to the life and witness of First Baptist Church in Needham as we lean into the next new thing that God has planned for us.
