A Letter from the Pastor

June 2023

In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams (Joel 2:28).

Dear First Baptist Church community,

This will be my final letter to you as Senior Pastor of First Baptist Church in Needham. From here on, I will be on the staff of our merged church entity primarily as a pastoral care provider - continuing in visits and calls to those home-bound members of our community, serving alongside my colleagues of First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain: Rev. Ashlee Wiest-Laird, Pastor; Rev. Darrell Hamilton II, Administrative Pastor; and Pastor Ben Herrmann, Pastor of Formation and Outreach. I welcome this shift in role and responsibility, but oh what an honor it has been to serve as your pastor in all the ways the recent years have afforded me. You are a beautiful community of faith, humbly seeking Christ's witness and the will of God for your life. You have undertaken a most faithful and awe-inspiring task of seeking the call of God in the life of this church community, even daring to move toward closing, trusting that God's goodness would hold you and bring you into a newness of life - you have exhibited a willingness to follow and go wherever God leads, a willingness to let go of control and offer everything you have toward the possibility of something new.

The early church, when it was starting out, was similarly called to a new, bold, and faithful witness – a new beginning. The disciples of Christ pooled their resources together, trusting in the support of community, and in the wild, unpredictable, yet life-giving Spirit to creatively cultivate a reimagining of ministry in the name of Christ - to reveal a new sense of what community could be like, new meaning and understanding to be witnessed, and new ministry possibilities that would emerge. Like fire from above, a new energy infused those gathered together, a new purpose and meaning was made known and understandable to all, and miracles continued to make themselves known. Even to this day, new miracles are being born into our midst, before our very senses.

I believe that miracles of the Spirit will continue to make themselves known in and through you, in and through our new iteration of ministry together with First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain. In every end is a new beginning, and just as the prophet Joel insinuates, even in times of ending, there are plenty of amazing things to witness, and yet to be revealed. This ending of one iteration

of ministry will yield plentiful moments of powerful prophetic imagination, and dreams, and visions in abundance to behold as we begin anew. Keep alert and pay attention to the goodness yet to be. Participate in it. Give towards it. Pray for it. Be active and involved in its creation. Don't miss out on witnessing the miracles of the Spirit yet to be revealed in this new thing God is doing in our midst.








Memorial Plaques at Grotonwood:





Rev. Ashlee Wiest-Laird, a native of Louisville, Kentucky, Ashlee studied religion and sociology at Wake Forest University and received an M.Div. from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1991. For four years, she served as the Southern Baptist chaplain at Harvard University and then spent a year working with Sabeel Liberation Theology Center and the Middle East Council of Churches in Jerusalem. In 1998 Ashlee completed an S.T.M. degree in religion and society from the Andover Newton Theological School. Having received standing in the American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts, she served as an interim pastor in

Allston, MA and as an associate pastor at Seattle First Baptist Church. In September 2003, Ashlee was blessed to be called to pastor the The First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain. Over her years as pastor in JP she has overseen the renewal and rebuilding of the congregation and the church building and has encouraged the church to embrace social justice ministries as integral to the gospel message of Jesus. She is married to Lance Laird and mom to Naim, Aidan and Mycah.



Rev. Darrell Hamilton is an ordained Baptist minister and graduate from Wake Forest School of Divinity where he received his Masters in Divinity in 2017, and earned his degree in Political Science from the University of Central Oklahoma in 2012. His ministry and leadership is centered on advancing diversity, inclusion, and advocacy for the vulnerable and marginalized to inspire our world toward greater justice and love for all people.

Rev. Hamilton is the former Executive Minister for Operations and Resource Development at Middle Collegiate Church in New York. Prior he was the Pastor for Formation and Outreach

at the First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the Alliance of Baptists and has held leadership positions as the Program Director for City Mission's Urban Pastoral Ministry Program, the Massachusetts Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival, and on the Board of Directors for The American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts. Rev. Hamilton currently serves as Protestant Chaplain at Babson College.

Lastly, Rev. Hamilton is the father of a beautiful daughter, Kaylani Rae, and regards fatherhood as the most important ministry he has been both blessed by and called to do.



Alex Olsen has performed in world-renowned venues including Rose Hall, Symphony Hall, and Lincoln Center alongside genre-defining artists such as Wynton Marsalis, John Oates of Hall and Oates, and the Boston Symphony Orchestra. Alex is known for his inventive compositions and improvisation drawing inspiration from his studies in jazz, classic orchestral, and hip-hop. Alex graduated from the Berklee College of Music with honors and is now frequently playing in the Boston music scene.



Ben Herrmann serves as the Pastor for Formation and Outreach at First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain. A 2023 graduate of Boston University School of Theology, Ben holds a Master of Divinity which he tailored toward the work of Interfaith Leadership and Queer Christian Theology.

Ben also holds a vocal performance degree from the University of Massachusetts-Lowell, and taught music to children ranging in age from preschool through third grade for 7 years prior to his call to pastoral ministry. While he is no longer active in his musical profession, his love for music, children, and education often come

in handy as he plans for worship, children's programming, and Bible study each week at First Baptist.

When he is not ministering to the community of Jamaica Plain, Ben finds restfulness in the artistic endeavors of writing poetry, creating stained glass art, and practicing piano.


Kym Barboza-Owens is the Food Justice Coordinator for First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain's Food Hub and Food Outreach programming.
