Beloved FBC Needham community,

How is it that we are able to enter into a season of Thanksgiving year after year, into times of gratitude over and over again? You'd think it might get old - that the act of giving thanks would grow tiresome. Sure, there are definitely times when it is difficult to find gratitude at the ready – when one shoe drops after another, one world calamity after another, one personal grief, loss, diagnosis after another...

Yet, somehow in the middle of everything, gratitude surfaces, bubbling up to the top of the murky and sometimes turbulent waters of life, bringing us up with it.

In every day, we each experience something of goodness. It may be small, it may be quiet, and ordinary, but there is something good for us to find, to seek, to be grateful for there. I know this because I know that God is there – in each day – with us through whatever comes our way; and that means love is there - in every day. That is a beautiful thought indeed – every day we have love, and therefore something to celebrate with each rising of the sun.

Creative Callings Year 3, Pivoting ADMINISTRATION STEWARDSHIP & PASTORAL ACCOMPANIMENT through TRANSITION

With a congregational vote on Sunday, June 27, 2021, the Administration Ministry was tasked with developing a plan for closing the church. Our Administration Ministry has been diligently meeting to develop a plan to bring before the congregation, while **each member of the congregation has been encouraged to do their own good work of prayerfully discerning what community of faith they may wish to visit or consider joining.** Pastor Daryn has been available, and will continue to be available, to offer spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and reflection upon request as we move forward.

The Administration Ministry has been engaged in discernment with community partners and others in ministry around future possibilities for our resources and property. All along we have been engaged with the hopes that our resources will continue to meet the needs of our Needham community and will continue to uphold and honor the legacy of First Baptist Church in Needham's ministry within the community.

Recent discernment has led us into conversations with First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain about the potential for a merger of our assets and ministries. This has been life-giving possibility to hold. On November 4, 2022, The First Baptist Church of Jamaica Plain voted unanimously at a congregational meeting to engage in further discernment around the possibility of a merger between our congregations. On November 5, 2022, FBC Needham's Administration Ministry unanimously approved a recommendation "to pursue a mutually agreeable partnership in whatever legal form would be agreeable with FBCJP and enter into discussions and negotiations with them." Some implications of this partnership are that it would allow for our building and property to continue to steward inclusive, creative and meaningful ministry for the arts, social justice mission, and the overall wellness of our Needham community. It would facilitate an ongoing relationship with some of our most valued community partners, and community's social service providers, and would provide potential worship space for some of our neighboring Baptist and ecumenical colleagues who are in need of space for their ministries and the sharing of the Gospel – the good news of God's love.

The Administration Ministry is discerning with FBCJP what this might practically look like, and is in the beginning phases of imagining next steps with them. If it is determined that this is a feasible and agreeable way forward for both congregations, the next step would be a future congregational meeting, during which a vote would be taken to approve the recommendation of the Administration Ministry toward partnership. The Administration Ministry and your pastor will continue to keep you apprised of our process and provide support as you need it along this journey.






THE FRONT PORCH RESTORATION CONTINUES \dots
